Timeline

Early July 2015

Distribute Save the Date announcement by email and postcard to RMP participants. The announcement will ask RMP participants to pre-register with the RMP if they plan to attend the RMP Annual Meeting on Day 2 of the State of the Estuary Conference. The RMP will set up a website for pre-registration.

Late July 2015

The RMP participants who pre-registered will be sent a link to officially register for the conference. If they only plan to attend on Day 2, the registration will be free. If they plan to attend both days of the conference, the cost will be \$100 per person. The RMP has pre-paid for approximately 100 people to attend Day 2 of the conference.
